
Science – How do we change as we grow?



Key vocabulary

Lifecycle- is the different stages of life for a living thing. **Mammal**- A warm-blooded vertebrate animal of a class that is distinguished by the possession of hair or fur, females that secrete milk for their young, and typically give birth of live young.

Gestation period- foetal development period from the time of conception until birth.

Foetus- an unborn or unhatched offspring of a mammal.

Puberty- time when the body begins to develop and change as you move from a child to an adult.

Reproduction - the production of offspring by a sexual or asexual process.


